ABOUT WRANGLERS CAMPGROUND...

Wranglers Campground is a specialized camping facility which provides year-round opportunities for horseback riding and wagon driving enthusiasts. Services include an activity court, showers, camping shelters, guided trail rides, and farrier and blacksmith services. Wranglers Outpost offers limited camping and equestrian supplies and food service.

CAMPSITE GUIDELINES...

During your stay with us, please help provide a quality experience for all our visitors.

1. Campsites are available on a first-come, first-served basis or by reservation. For reservations, please refer to the “Reservations” section. For first-come, first-served sites, at least one person 18 years old or older and a proper camping unit must occupy the site the first night. After the first night, the camping unit may not be left unattended for more than a 24 hour period without permission.
2. First-come, first-served campsites will be assigned upon registering at the gatehouse. When a campsite is rented, it cannot be re-rented or reserved until the last day the site has been paid for. You are encouraged to rent or reserve the site for your entire intended stay. The site may or may not be available for you to extend your stay. If you would like to change sites you must return to the gatehouse to allow staff to check availability, as it may be rented or reserved. If requested, we will gladly change your site to another, if available. If gatehouse staff is unavailable, refer to the After Hours Notice posted on gatehouse information board.
3. You shall not change sites without first checking with gatehouse staff. If you do so, you run the risk of having to move to another site or having your equipment towed at your expense.
4. Visitation for registered campers is between 7 a.m. and 11 p.m. During this time, a \$5 visitor fee per vehicle is charged. (After 11 p.m., a full camping fee is charged.)
5. All camping units must be on prepared gravel sites. Please refer to “Campsite Capacity” for regulations.
6. Quiet hours are observed between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m. Please return to your campsite during quiet hours as a courtesy to others. Loud music, parties, etc., will not be tolerated. Horses shall not be ridden in the camp ground after 10 p.m.
7. Generator use is not permitted during quiet hours, except in the 24-hour generator field.
8. Check-out time is 3:30 p.m. and is strictly enforced as an arriving reservation could be impacted. Arrangements may be made through gatehouse staff to utilize the Day-Use Area for those wanting to ride later in the day; you must communicate your intentions prior to your scheduled departure date and time. Late fees may be assessed or your equipment may be towed at your expense.
9. Camping is limited to 21 consecutive days on any site, with the exception of our Seasonal Camping Program. After 21 days, campers must be moved from the site for a minimum of 7 days prior to returning to the previously occupied site.
10. To properly occupy a site, all camping units must be fully set up on the gravel pad. Tents must display a valid tent tag that is visible from the campground road. Original site must be occupied during the first 24 hours.
11. Day users are required to use the Day-Use parking lot.
12. All refunds shall be on a case-by-case basis.
13. Temporary fences are not permitted. Metal panels may be used within the tethering areas. In primitive overflow areas, panels shall be used within impacted area. Please help us avoid unnecessary wear and tear in

- grassy areas.
14. Tether your horses so they cannot chew bark off trees. Damage to trees is punishable by a maximum fine of \$1,000.
15. Horses are not permitted on graveled living space of campsites.
16. When cleaning your campsite, use manure pits located at the barns or pile manure at edge of campground roads or at end of barns, on opposite side from water hydrants so maintenance staff can remove it easily. To protect public water supply from harmful contamination, **DO NOT TIE HORSES OR PILE MANURE NEAR WATER HYDRANTS.** Disconnect hoses from hydrant after use.
17. Stall cleaning is the responsibility of stall renters. Daily cleaning helps reduce flies and makes cleaning easier.
18. Displaying “For Sale” signs, attempting to sell goods or services, advertising such services, or distributing written material without a Forest Service permit is prohibited.

CAMPSITE CAPACITY...

Each campsite is limited to a maximum of eight people per site and three camping units, only two of which may be wheeled. A camping fee is charged for each camping unit. A second camping unit may be added to a site; all fees shall apply. A maximum of four wheeled units is allowed on any one site, vehicles and campers. Additional vehicles and visitors will be charged and required to park in Day-Use Area. Camping units are defined as follows: wheeled camping units (horse trailer with living quarters, travel trailer, motor home, truck camper, truck with topper, van, pop-up trailer, or fifth wheel) or tent (staff approved sleeping tent). Tarps, stock trailers, awnings, dining canopies, screen tents, or vehicles other than those listed, may not solely occupy a campsite.

A child's tent is counted as one camping unit and will be allowed free of charge with each paid camping unit as long as only children 17 years of age and under occupy it.

EXAMPLES PERMITTED:

- A. Motor home, horse trailer with living space, and tent;
- B. Pop-up trailer and two tents.

EXAMPLES NOT PERMITTED:

- A. Motor home, pop-up trailer, and van
- B. Horse trailer, pop-up trailer, and fifth-wheel

SEASONAL & GROUP CAMPING...

A limited number of campsites are available for seasonal camping for two to nine months.

OUR FEES...

A camping fee is charged for each camping unit.
(see *Campsite Capacity*)

National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Access, Senior Passes, Golden Age, and Access Passes honored for 50% off basic fee. Water will not be available at full service sites in March and November. Water is available in select locations throughout the campground year-round. See campground map for details.

OTHER SERVICES...

Ice and firewood are available for purchase at the Outpost and Gatehouse. Guided trail rides/riding stables, soft-drink machines, washers and dryers are available Apr-Oct, and heated restrooms with shower facilities are available year-round. (Vending machine sales benefit Land Between The Lakes Association.) Wranglers Outpost offers limited camping supplies and food services. Farrier/Blacksmith services are available on weekends from Apr to Nov.

CAMPING SHELTERS (CABINS)...

Camping Shelters are ideal for people who want a more comfortable camping experience. One-room shelters sleep either four or eight and include: one double bed and one bunk bed or one double bed and three bunk beds, ceiling fan with light, small table and chairs, and electrical outlets. Camping units are not allowed to utilize electrical services at cabins.

RESERVATIONS...

Reservations are available for camping shelters and select campsites at Wranglers and Piney Campgrounds. Reservations are also available for select campsites at Hillman Ferry and Energy Lake Campgrounds.

1. Reservations for Wranglers may be made via our website at lbl.org or by phone at 1-800-525-7077.
2. Reservations may be made up to six months in advance and no less than two days before arrival.
3. Non-refundable reservation fees shall be charged (see Our Fees).
4. Change fees apply when a customer requests a change to existing reservations (see Our Fees).
5. Customers will receive a full refund less the non-refundable Reservation fee for cancellations more than three days before scheduled arrival.
6. Customers shall be charged the non-refundable Reservation fee, the Late Cancellation fee and the first night's camping fee for cancellations three days or less before scheduled arrival.
7. Check-in time for reserved sites is 4:30 p.m. Check-out time is 3:30 p.m. A \$16 fee will be added for late departures.

FOR YOUR SAFETY...

1. Pets MUST be on a leash of 6 ft. or less and under physical control while in the campground.
2. For health and sanitation purposes, you are required to clean up after your pet. Pets are prohibited in all buildings.
3. Campers under age 18 must be accompanied by an adult.
4. Immediately report any theft, loss, accident, or disturbance to the staff or call 911.

5. Fireworks are prohibited at all times.
6. Firearms are prohibited except during LBL hunting seasons by licensed and permitted hunters only.
7. All campfires must be contained in designated firerings. Please extinguish all campfires thoroughly before vacating the site.
8. Proof of a current EIA (Coggin's) Test for all horses and a current health certificate in compliance with Kentucky state law is required. Refer to www.kyagr.com or call 502-564-4696.
9. Fluorescent triangles are required on all wagons. Front and rear lights are required for night rides.
10. After 10 p.m., no riding or wagon driving allowed in campground.
11. Jumping or racing horses or wagons is strictly prohibited. Keep horses at a walk while riding in the campground.
12. Stallions must be kept in a stall or trailer at night.
13. Do not connect hoses to faucets or plug campers into outlets at shower buildings.
14. State law prohibits public consumption of alcoholic beverages.

RULES OF THE ROAD...

1. A 15 mph speed limit is enforced throughout the campground. Be courteous and cautious in congested areas.
2. All-terrain vehicles (ATVs), bicycles, golf-carts, and mopeds are prohibited. Please visit Turkey Bay Off-Highway Vehicle (OHV) Area for riding.
3. Licensed motorcycles are permitted in the campground. Please be courteous to horseback riders.
4. After quiet hours, please limit vehicle traffic to entering and/or exiting campground.
8. Metal detectors are prohibited in LBL.

OUR ENVIRONMENT NEEDS YOUR HELP...

LBL is working toward a cleaner, healthier environment.

1. Recycle aluminum cans, glass containers, plastic bottles, and metal cans at Recycling Station near Dump Station.
2. State law prohibits discharge of gray or black water. Please use dump station. Citations will be written.
3. Vehicle maintenance is prohibited within campground.
4. Do not clean fish or game in showers, sinks, or water faucets/hydrants.
5. For your safety, drinking water is treated and monitored by employees with state certifications.
6. To protect water supply from harmful bacteria, please do not leave water hoses attached to water hydrants when not in use. Hoses must be disconnected after use.
7. This campground recycles. Recycling bins are available for your use throughout the campground.
8. Wildlife and plants are protected. Please do not feed the wildlife.
9. Do not nail or carve on trees or hang lanterns on them. It will damage and destroy our natural resources.
10. Do not wash vehicles or horse trailers in campground. Run-off from these activities pollutes groundwater, is a wasteful use of the water supply, and is unlawful.
11. Horse washing is allowed only at horse wash stations.
12. Please use weed-seed-free hay and feed, and pack out unused hay and straw to prevent the introduction of noxious weeds.
13. Do not wash dishes, brush teeth, or wash up at potable water sources.
