Reservation Information

Welcome to the USDA Forest Service Land Between The Lakes (LBL) National Recreation Area. At LBL, you will find 170,000 acres of wildlife, history, and outdoor recreation opportunities, wrapped by 300 miles of undeveloped shoreline.

Reserve a special day at LBL for your group or organization at one of our five pavilions. Make the pavilion the center of your visit, a place where you can meet, hold a picnic, or enjoy the company of your friends, family, or co-workers.

Pavilion reservations must be made at least 10 working days in advance of the desired date. A confirmation letter will be sent to confirm each reservation. The reservation fee is **non-refundable**, unless cancellation is made at least 10 days prior to date of arrival. Reservations can be made up to six months in advance.

Pavilion Reservation Availability

Fenton:

- \$50 per reservation, **per day**
- Accommodates up to 70 adults
- Electricity, lights, and water
- Group-size grill
- Chemical toilets
- Available year-round

Golden Pond Visitor Center:

9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (Entrance gate closes at 5 p.m. Hours may be extended upon special request.)

- \$50 per reservation, **per day**
- Accommodates up to 60 adults
- Electricity, lights, and water
- Group-size grill
- Playground equipment
- Restrooms in the Visitor Center
- Available daily, June 1 - Aug. 31; weekdays after 2 p.m. and weekends, Sept. 1 - May 31.

The Homeplace:

9 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. (Entrance gate closes at 5 p.m.)

- \$50 per reservation, **per day**
- Accommodates up to 60 adults
- Electricity and water; no lights
- Restrooms in The Homeplace Interpretive Center
- Available daily, June 1 - Aug. 31; weekdays after 2 p.m. and weekends, Sept. 1 - May 31.

Woodlands Nature Station:

- \$50 per reservation, **per day**
- Accommodates up to 60 adults
- Water and electricity; no lights
- Group-size grill
- Accessible Restrooms in the Boarding House
- Available daily, June 1 - Aug. 31; weekdays after 2 p.m. and weekends, Sept. 1 - May 31.

Jones Creek:

- \$20 per reservation, **per day**
- Accommodates up to 18 adults
- No nearby electricity or water
- Chemical toilets
- Small grill and fire ring
- Restrooms at Skunk Hollow (open mid-March to mid-October)
- Available year-round

Guidelines for Pavilion use:

1. Place all garbage in the appropriate refuse containers provided.
2. Turn off electricity when not in use to conserve energy.
3. Return picnic tables to their original positions.
4. By law, public consumption of alcohol is prohibited.
5. Wildlife and plant life are protected. Do not cut or pull up shrubs or plants, or drive nails into trees.
6. Fireworks are prohibited. Firearms are prohibited except during LBL gun hunting seasons by licensed and permitted hunters.
7. Report losses, thefts, accidents, or disturbances to Forest Service Law Enforcement at 1-877-861-2457. The Forest Service is not responsible for theft or loss of personal property.
8. No commercial signs without permit.
